Avg. Earnings Per Job (2023)

Regional average earnings per job are \$7.9K below the national average earnings of \$82.6K per job.

Takeaways

- As of 2023 the region's population **declined by 1.0%** since 2018, falling by 19,734. Population is expected to **decrease by 1.5%** between 2023 and 2028, losing 30,061.
- From 2018 to 2023, jobs declined by 1.4% in Southeastern Wisconsin from 1,120,312 to 1,104,914. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 3.9% by 5.3%. As the number of jobs declined, the labor force participation rate increased from 65.8% to 66.0% between 2018 and 2023.
- Concerning educational attainment, 23.7% of the selected regions' residents possess a Bachelor's Degree (2.6% above the national average), and 9.4% hold an Associate's Degree (0.6% above the national average).
- The top three industries in 2023 are Restaurants and Other Eating Places, Education and Hospitals (Local Government), and General Medical and Surgical Hospitals.




Feb 2024 Labor Force Breakdown






Unemployment by Gender



Unemployment by Ethnicity







Job Trends



Labor Force Participation Rate Trends








Millennials


Retiring Soon




Racial Diversity












Top Growing Industries




Top Industry Employment Concentration








Top Industry GRP






Top Occupation Employment Concentration







In 2022, there were 28,890 graduates in Southeastern Wisconsin. This pipeline has remained stable (neither grown nor shrunk) over the last 4 years.
