**Programs (projects or services):**

- Continue to develop and support the Washington County Office of Emergency Management and its functions: Disaster Aid Management, Emergency Operations Center.
- Continue to review and annually update the Washington County Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan (CEMP), which provides guidance for responding to and recovering from disasters throughout the County.
- Continue to review and update the Washington County Hazard Mitigation Plan, which provides guidance designed to reduce overall risk to people, property and infrastructure from future hazard events, while also reducing the costs of future disaster aid programs throughout the County.
- Continue the support of the Voluntary Organizations Active in Disasters preparedness/response programs.
- Continue to provide Emergency Management Services and coordinate with local governments and State agencies in disaster recovery.
- Consider opportunities to create efficiencies through shared services.
- Continue to assure compliance with mandatory Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act Laws and facilitate the existence of the mandatory Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC).
- Continue to coordinate and manage disaster aid for the County. By law reporting and reimbursements for State/Federal disaster aid programs must be channeled through the County Emergency Management Office.
